

Item, to my son Joseph Jewett I give my now dwelling house, all at present but what part I have given to my wife during her widowhood, if she live in it, & upon her marriage or leaving it then that part to be to him; also, I give him the barns, orchards, yards, swamps, & toll or field above the street, being all my lands lying in the field called Bradford street lots, & one Commonage or freehold upon Commons of Rowley; also, fourteen acres of upland lying in the west end ox pasture; also, three acres of land lying behind Honsley Hill; also, four acres lying upon the plaine called Great Meadow Plaine; also, I confirm to him which he hath possessed that I gave him two acres of upland lying in the farme; also, one acre of marsh joyning upon that which we call the Elders division; also, all that marsh which we call the far division, near the place called Stackyard; also, one cow gate upon commons of Rowley, with the division belonging to it; & my will is that my said son Joseph pay or cause to be paid thirty and four pounds to his sisters, namely, to Anna, three pounds; to Mary, five pounds; to Sarah, twelve pounds; to Elizabeth, four pounds; to Faith, ten pounds; all to be paid in Rowley in corne or cattle within seven years after my decease. But if my said son Joseph depart this life, and it be not payed within the time prefixt, my will is that my executor sell soe much of any lands I give him as shall pay the said legacies as are then unpaid, for that end, & I hereby empower him to confirm such sale.

Item, to my daughter Anna, besides the three score pounds I have already given her, I give her all my lands, being nine acres more or less, at the place called Bachelors field; also, my land in the new plaine, being about six acres; also, that parcell of my marsh which lieth between that which was Richard Swan's formerly & the ditch, being one acre more or less; also, one acre & a quarter of my medow called Bachelors medow, all which lands & medow I give her during her natural life, and after her decease I give the same to her son Jonathan Barker, if he live to the age of twenty & one years, with my division of grate marsh in Hog Island, and if he do not, I give the same lands & medows amongst the rest of her children which she shall leave, who live to that age or day of marriage. Further, I give her three pounds, to be payed by my son, Joseph Jewett.

Item, I give to my daughter, Mary Haseltine (besides the three score pounds I have already paid her, & the twenty-four acres of land confirmed by deed of gift), two acres of marsh which was
