William Beatty, born 1729, died May 1, 1803. The first known of him was in the Mohawk Valley N.Y. — Married Mary Dorothy Grock, about 1755 in Frederick County Maryland. — She came from Sutherbury Germany to America when two years old. — They had 16 children, 12 sons and 4 daughters, all born on the same farm about four (4) miles from Frederick, Md, on the Monocacy river.
