I write to you both in one letter, since it is in matters of so near concerne for the peace and happiness of myselfe, my Wife, and all of you of my familie, I am first to advise that yesterday I rec<sup>d</sup> a letter from my son Paschall from Barbadoes, who is on boord the Shoram, w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>r</sup> Gou<sup>r</sup> Coll. Montgomery, to whom he is well recommended & much considered, soe that he pretends to have assurance of obtaining anything that lies in y<sup>r</sup> Gouvernors gift Either at New York or in the Jersey's, and as he is ignorant of what may be of most advantage, he prays me to beg of you that you meet him or send y<sup>r</sup> Advise to him as soon as possible to Yorke what may be most proper for him to aske, y<sup>r</sup> diligence herein may be of Good availle, & consequence to him. I am now to tell you that my Selve & your Mother being Growne ould and infirme we have resolued upon the settlement of what smale Estate remains w<sup>th</sup> us, to w<sup>ch</sup> intent our designe to surrender up our Island<sup>3</sup> unto Temple
