

NOTES AND CORRECTIONS.

Page 3, l. 14.—Henry Tomlinson was son of George Tomlinson and Maria Hyde of Yorkshire, England, who was married in Jan., 1600. They removed from Yorkshire to Derby, Derbyshire. Henry was a weaver by trade.

Page 3, l. 21.—The reservoir in Derby is not a town reservoir, but is for the use of the factories in Birmingham.

Page 4, l. 3, etc.—From the old history of Derby it appears that Stephen Pierson had two children, b. before 1670, but their names are not given. A Joseph Pierson drew lots in Derby Mar. 12, 1702, who was probably another son of Stephen.

Page 4, No. 13.—Abigail Pierson m, James St. John, son of James, who was b. March 30, 1738.

Page 5, l. 20.—Abraham Pierson, Sr., was selectman after 1711, and quite frequently until 1741.

Page 8, No. 47.—George M. Pierson studied law with Judge Swan and married his daughter. One of George M.'s children married Prince Von Linder of Prussia.

Page 11, No. 97.—Mr. and Mrs. Tryon removed to New Connecticut, Ohio.

Page 13, No. 126.—Laura Pierson's husband was Moses G. Betts. She was his first wife. His second wife was 250 Caroline Pierson, a niece of the first wife.

Page 13, No. 131.—Hepsey *Peet*, not *Post*.
