### 1 Thomas Gibson & Sophia De Lano

Rev William Thomas Gibson, D.D. LL.D. d Utica Nov 23-1896 (Grad Hobart Coll. 1842 Prin Waterloo Acad. ed. newspaper & studied law & adm. Bar Enter. Epis. ch. ord. by Bish. Delancey 1861 organ. St Geo's ch. ed. Gospel Messenger 1872 ed. Ch. Eclectic for clergy of High Ch. au. "Adulescentiae Folia"—reminiscences of his youth: "known as part of the "Military Tract," surveyed by Simon De Witt, and assigned to soldiers of the Revolution and their heirs, which accounts for the remarkable military spirit of those early days, long before the civil war. We had "venerable men," survivors of the Revolution, to grace our Fourth of July celebrations, and we had our brass six pounders, captured at Yorktown, to thunder our defiance of all foreign foes, and we had drum majors who fired our boyish enthusiasm as completely as did our fathers and grandfathers in the two wars with Great Britain, then not so long past. As a child we used to see as many as six hundred cavalry charge at full gallop across a forty acre field discharging their great horse pistols like a feu de joie, wheeling and galloping in separate squadrons to the place of return, looking most formidable
