

Schofield's Staff 1 Dec 1889 Resigned 1893 to practise law. Appointed by Mayor Strong 13 Feb 1895 a Police Commissioner of N. Y. Treas. of Board 6 May 1896 to 1 Jan '98—the other Comm's. being Gen. Fred. D Grant & Gov. & Col. Roosevelt—Was unanimously elect. Major " Squadron A " N. G. '98 " the crack cavalry of N. Y." Later at Union club was presented by Gen. Fitzgerald & staff with a gold mounted sabre—He having been Eng. officer on do.—In Apr. '98 (Spanish War) he rec'd leave of absence to act on staff of Gen. Wilson as Chief Quartermaster 6th Army Corps, rank L't. Col. Vols. Camp Thomas Chickamauga Ga.

" Having resigned my commission in the United States volunteers, I hereby resume my command of the squadron, to take effect from August 16, '98.

" The commanding officer feels confident that every member of the squadron will be glad to join heartily in a welcome to be given Troop A upon its return from Porto Rico. On account of uncertainty as to the time and place of its arrival, the details of the ceremonies cannot now be announced, but they will consist of the formation of the squadron to escort the troop through the city to the armory, where a reception to the troop by the members of the squadron and their friends will be held.

" The next Adjutant-General will be no tin soldier, but a West Pointer who has seen actual service. Col. Roosevelt has selected Major Andrews because he knows him personally to be fully qualified for this important position, more important even in the future than in the past. Politics has played no part in this appointment. He ought to be a good enough Republican by this time, having voted for McKinley 1896, for Seth Low 1897 and for the Republican State ticket and a Congressman 1898. It is a purely military appointment, personal to the Gov., and was made, we understand, without protest from any quarter. Major Andrews was the choice of the officers of the National Guard, as well as of the Gov.-elect, and his selection is a happy augury for the future of the Guardsmen organizations.—Mail & Express."
