

he privately suffered that others might find relief. 1830 I was around Cape Horn, in the ship "Oregon." Not visiting Talcahuana as intended, I wrote to Capt D'o and I received his answer; he wrote just after the earth-quake which destroyed his house; he narrates the event, and his own efforts in climbing the mountain just as the return wave swept away their house, the closing lines are strictly characteristic "I have lost every-thing I possess on earth, and now I am ready for the first fashion," Paul D'o." In one of his visits to Fairhaven, at our house, he sent me, then ten, to Mr Joshua D'o, to borrow his fowling peice; the message I bore: "Tell him I can't eat, drink, sleep or smoke, until I have a gunning scrape"—The next day he started for Rocky-point, east of Fort Phoenix, the wind was S. E. moderately strong with light rain, he seemed to think nothing of this but it was imperative the gun should be dry; so he strapped a knap-sack shaped piece of ship canvas around his waist, in the fold of which the lock of the gun was placed, & took position at extreme edge of point of rocks, next the tidal wave; & patiently sat, cramped & waiting the transit of the fowl, if one came near enough he was very sure to fetch him on the wing; he'd bring the gun up behind the fowl, and move it forward faster than it was flying; the instant he saw feathers he pulled; the result was generally fatal. He never fired until a fowl had passed for feathers offered less resistance to the shot, & the slanting direction was more effectual being toward and into the vitals. At 11 o'clock I was sent home with what I could carry, with instructions to bring him a lunch. 1 P.M. I was back, he had added nothing. When the fowl returned from their days feeding up river, the sport revived to some extent, result: one 9 lb. loon, 2 old squams, 3 whistlers & 7 shelldrakes.
