Memoranda. Robert Swartwout was appointed on April 5, 1805, adjutant in Lieutenant-Colonel Thomas Olcott's regiment of Onondaga County militia. On April 6, 1807, he was appointed captain of a company of grenadiers in Lieutenant-Colonel Isaac Hall's regiment of Onondaga County militia. While residing in Trumansburgh, Tompkins County, he was elected an assemblyman and represented his constituents in the sixty-first session of the New York legislature from January 2 to April 18, 1838, and in the sixty-third, from January 7 to May 14, 1840. He was also a judge. His daughter, Mary, married in Hector, October 26, 1815, Stephen Stillwell; Huldah married, April 5, 1817, Levi F. Adams, and lived in Wells, Bradford County, Pa.; Caroline married in September, 1820, William Jaycocks, and lived in Syracuse, N. Y.; Adelia married, in 1826, Horace R. Jerome, and lived in Saginaw, Mich.; Alexander Hamilton married, in 1840, Sylvania Nye, and lived in Hector, N. Y.; Juliana married, in 1826, Jerome Rapelye, and after his death, Stephen Baright.
