Memoranda. Isaac Voorheis Swarthout passed his boyhood at the old homestead on the east bank of Seneca Lake, in the town of Romulus, Seneca County. When fifteen years old, for the purpose of subscribing for a weekly newspaper, he caught a quantity of fish and sold them in the village of Ovid. At his request, the postmaster there sent the money to Buffalo, and thereafter a newspaper came regularly to his address, it being the first that the family had the pleasure of enjoying as their own by subscription. By the removal of the household to Michigan in 1837, he, when twenty-two years of age, was elected supervisor of Ovid township, in Clinton County, where he had purchased a farm, and was re-elected to the same office seven different times. In 1850 he sold his farm and purchased another in Victor township, in the same county, where he served ten years as supervisor of that township. In 1894 he was living in Laingsburg, Michigan. His daughter, Frances A., died December 16, 1871. Minnie married in Victor township, November 22, 1888, Charles L. Warren, born in Ovid township, Michigan, August 27, 1866. Emma married in Laingsburg, Michigan, November 1, 1893, Charles L. Warren.

Memoranda. When Ralph Swarthout, with his parents, brothers, and sisters, from Seneca County, N. Y., settled in Michigan, in 1837, the same year the state was admitted into the United States, they found there nothing but what was natural to a wild and uncultivated region. Bears, deer, and wolves were abundant, and he became an expert hunter, and claims to have killed there twenty-two black bears and more than five hundred deer. His experiences while in quest of game embraced many hazards, but it was his good fortune to escape the perils endangering him, and is still living in the enjoyment of good health in Laingsburg, Michigan.
