**Frederick Starin**, son of Philip Frederick Adam (14), was born in 1744. He was a farmer by occupation, cultivating an extensive tract of land in the town of Charleston (now Glen), Montgomery county, N. Y.\* He was a prominent member of the Dutch Reformed Church at Caughnawaga, N. Y., over which Dominie Abraham Van Horn was pastor for forty-five years. If the records of that church could be found, it would be seen that they contain many interesting facts relating to the Starin family. Mr. Starin married Elizabeth Frank, who was born in 1746, and was a descendant of that Stephen Frank who came over to America in the same vessel with Nicholas (1), in 1696. He died April 1, 1826. She died November 12, 1835.
