Adam Staring, son of Henry (17), was born in what was then Montgomery county, N. Y., in 1752, and served with credit, during the entire war, as ensign in his father's company, which was attached to Colonel Bellinger's regiment of the 4th Battalion of the Tryon County Militia. He married Hannah Harter. He died in Herkimer county, N. Y., in 1812. She died at Syracuse, N. Y. (where she is buried), in 1835.
