Jane Starin, daughter of Joseph (68), by his first wife, married, in 1825, Charles Gardenier of Glen, N. Y., a descendant of Jacob Gardenier of Mohawk, N. Y., who served as captain of the 1st Company in the 3d Battalion of the Tryon County Militia under General Herkimer at the Battle of Oriskany. She was born at Glen on the 22d of February, 1805, and died at Fultonville, N. Y., on the 4th of April, 1865.

An uncle of Jane Starin's husband was Lieutenant Samuel Gardenier, also of Mohawk, N. Y. He, together with Jacob Gardenier, was present at the sacking of Sir John Johnson's camp, and both were publicly complimented at the close of the battle in the "Order for the Day," by Colonel Marinus Willett. Elias Warren Starin, son of Joseph (68), by his second marriage, was born at Fultonville, N. Y., on the 29th of June, 1816. When a young man he was associated in the mercantile business with Erastus Charles Starin (157), and, subsequently, he engaged in the same pursuit at Boston, Mass. In 1833 he went
