J., December 1, 1835, lives (1892) with her only child, Mason B. Starring.

Delancey Dublois Starin, son of Myndert (69), was born at Johnstown, N. Y., on the 6th of August, 1817. He was married at Fort Plain, N. Y., on the 17th of June, 1850, by the Rev. C. G. McLean, D. D., to Emeline Frances Wagner, who was born at Fort Plain on the 3d of February, 1823. He removed to Glen, N. Y., in 1836; thence, in 1852, to New York city; and, in 1868, to Malden-on-the-Hudson, where he died November 2, 1866. For many years he carried on a lucrative commission business in New York city.

The wife of Delancey Dublois was the daughter of Joseph Wagner, Jr., who died at Fort Plain on the 13th of June, 1855. Joseph Wagner's wife was a Miss
