

In Oct., 1746, Jonathan Alvord was appointed collector for establishing a church at East Hampton, Conn. In 1748 Jonathan Alvord et al. were appointed to confer with Rev. Norton as to time of installment. (East Hampton Parish.)

May 15, 1760, Capt. Jonathan Alvord was chosen to "set the Psalm" at the East Hampton Church.

54. AARON ALVORD (*Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Northampton, Mass., July 16, 1713; died Torrington, Conn., 1767; married Durham, Conn., Nov. 6, 1739, Mehitable Strong, daughter of Eliakim and Mehitable (King) Strong. She was born Northampton, Mass., Sept. 5, 1715. Res. Durham, Conn., and Torrington, Conn. Children:

Aaron Alvord was farmer in Durham, Conn., until 1754 when he sold his farm and moved to Torrington, Conn., where he and his wife were members of the church in 1760.

Administration on the estate of Aaron Alvord was granted Mar. 3, 1767. (Litchfield Prob. Rec.)

The History of Goshen, Conn., states that William Alvord was the first miller in the town. The mill was located ten rods north of the road leading from East St. to Middle St. over Pie Hill. It also states that William Alvord's daughter married Chauncey Beach. It is therefore probably that the above reference is to Aaron Alvord.

There is a tradition that the three sons, Bela, Selah and Aaron, went to N. Y. State soon after the Revolution, one to New York City, another to Central N. Y., uncertain where the other settled. Bela alone could be traced. Mrs. Mehitable Alvord's father went to Durham about 1721.
