Benjamin Alvord of Montague, Mass., with his wife Abigail, transferred land in Windsor, Mass., to Samuel Baldwin, May 30, 1793. The same year John Lincklaen conveyed land in Chenango Co., N. Y., to Benjamin Alvord. He was buried in the Lyon Cemetery, Nelson, N. Y., and has a tombstone.

Rev. War Service: "Alvord, Benjamin, Sergeant, Capt. Joseph Starrow's Co., Col. David Leonard's Reg. Enlisted Feb. 25, 1777; dis. Apr. 10, 1777, marched on an expedition to Ticonderoga."

78. ELISHA ALVORD (*Joseph, Ebenezer, Alexander*), born Northampton, Mass., Mar. 15, 1731; died Cazenovia, N. Y., Nov. 23, 1807; married Northampton, Mass., Oct. 27, 1757, Mary Hamilton, perhaps daughter of Armour and Mary Hamilton. She was born prob. Blandford, Mass., about 1734; died Northampton, Mass., Jan. 2, 1794. Res. Northampton, Mass. Children:

Rev. War Service: "Alvord, Elisha, Jr., Private, Capt. Hezekiah Russel's Co., 2nd Volunteer Co., 2nd Hampshire Co. Reg. Pay roll for six days, service against the insurgents at Northampton, May 6, June 15, 16, 17, 1782; at Springfield, June 12, 1782, and at Hadley, June 13, 1782, by order of Elisha Porter, sheriff." (Mass. Soldiers in Rev.)

He was in the War of 1812. Administration on his estate was granted to his brother, William at Rutland, Vt., Oct., 1815; called of "Rutland."

204. Hannah, b. Northampton, Mass., July 5, 1768.

Elisha Alvord held the office of "Clerk for the Proprietors" of Northampton, from Oct. 25, 1763, when he took the oath, until Nov. 2, 1768, and perhaps later. He wrote an elegant hand. He was a merchant at Northampton, but did little business.
