JOHN ALVORD (*Elisha, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Fairfield, Conn., July 11, 1750; died Greenfield Hill, Conn., July 3, 1845; married 1st, Greenfield Hill, Conn., Nov. 11, 1772, Sarah Wakeman, daughter of Stephen and Rebecca (Morehouse) Wakeman. She was born Nov. 21, 1753; died Greenfield Hill, Conn., Apr. 26, 1779. He married 2nd, Greenfield Hill, Conn., Nov. 14, 1779, Abigail Banks, daughter of Nehemiah and Abigail (Bradley) Banks. John Alvord lived and died in the northern part of the parish of Greenfield, Conn. He was engaged in the manufacture of boots and shoes, employing a number of workmen. His shop was 20x40 ft. and two stories high. He was admitted to full communion in the church, Sept. 24, 1780.
