Josiah Gibbs was a Revolutionary soldier. He had children by his first wife, Lucy Mosham. The births of his children are recorded at Woodstock, Vt., but he seems to have lived chiefly at North Bridgewater. It is thought that he was born at "Old Middleboro."

218. ROXANA ALVORD (*Stephen, Joseph, Ebenezer, Alexander*), born Charlestown, N. H., Dec. 6, 1775; died Nashua, N. H., Mar. 9, 1859; married Woodstock, Vt., Oct. 10, 1798, Benjamin Burke, son of Solomon and Keziah (Benjamin) Burke. He was born Windsor, Vt., Feb. 21, 1775; died Nashua, N. H., Sept. 28, 1855. Res. Mrs. Roxana (Alvord) Burke united with the church at Windsor, Vt., Dec. 2, 1810:

"Mrs. Rocksallana Burke, having previously given satisfactory evidence to the church of her gracious state, and been duly propounded, was received to the communion and fellowship of the church." (Windsor, Vt., Ch. Rec.)

The immediate cause of her death appeared to be inflammation of the lungs or lung fever, although the infirmities of old age had afflicted her for some years.

Mr. Burke was often appointed by the church as delegate to ordinations and church meetings. He removed to Nashua, N. H., in May, 1826. He lived to a feeble old age, but gave evidence of strong faith as a devoted Christian.

219. ISAAC ALVORD (*Stephen, Joseph, Ebenezer, Alexander*), bapt. Charlestown, N. H., July 3, 1779; died prob. in Mich.;
