Morris Alvord first resided at Greens Farms, Conn., near the beach where at the present time the hotel stands. His house was burned and he moved to Southport and located on Mill River, where an old mill is now situated. He kept a store in Southport even while living at Greens Farms. He died of consumption.

An old record dated Apr. 10, 1818, mentions "Elihu Alvord formerly of Fairfield, Conn., now of Black Rock, N. Y." Mr. Fish, grandson of Elihu Alvord writes that his grandfather lived for a few years after leaving Conn. at Albany, N. Y., and was employed in the shipyards there. He removed from Ellicottville, N. Y., to Scot Co., Ia., in 1837 settling on a claim 18 miles north of Davenport. He
