East Longmeadow, Mass., 1850, Maria Pratt, daughter of Sylvanus and Malah (Frost) Pratt. She was born East Longmeadow, Mass., Sept. 13, 1817; died East Longmeadow, Mass., May 14, 1853. Res. Edwin Alvord was a painter by trade. Shortly before his wife's death he went to Illinois with his brothers-in-law, James and Edmond Pratt.
