Eliphaz S. Alvord was a man of unimpeachable character and it was said of him that his word was as good as a bond, when a young man, he injured his back so that he was compelled to use a cane in walking, and therefore was able to do no heavy work. For many years he sold books and engaged a man to go around the country in a wagon made specially for this purpose. He was very careful in small matters both morally and financially, so that at times he was called "close." But he showed great foresight in his investments. He was one of the first to invest in the Lake Shore and Mich. Southern Ry., though he was called "a fool" for putting money in a road that ran beside the lake.

Mr. Alvord was strictly patriotic, and took great interest in the affairs of the country. When news came that Gen. Lee had surrendered, he drove through the town with lines in one hand and dinner-bell in the other, ringing it with all his strength. He had also put sleigh-bells on his horse.

Withal he had a keen application of humor, and enjoyed immensely a joke, even when it was turned upon himself.

His widow married a Mr. Malty of Madison, O.
