

856. HANNAH ALVORD (*Dioclesian, Thomas Gould, Asahel, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Salina, N. Y., Nov. 17, 1814; died Syracuse, N. Y., June 11, 1894; married Salina, N. Y., May 29, 1833, Jerry Stevens, son of Jeremiah and Charlotte (Hurd) Stevens. He was born Onondaga Valley, N. Y., 1805; died Nevada City, Cal., Dec. 7, 1851. Res. Syracuse, N. Y. Children:

- a. Charles Alvord, b. Syracuse, N. Y., Feb. 12, 1834; d. Helena, Mont., Dec. 9, 1875, unm.; was killed in a mine by a stone rolling down the mountain, while two partners were cutting trees above.

Jerry Stevens was a dry goods merchant at Syracuse, N. Y., until Jan. 1849, when he went to Calif.

857. HORACE ALVORD (*Dioclesian, Thomas Gould, Asahel, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Salina, N. Y., July 23, 1817; died Superior, Wis., Sept. 18, 1899; married 1st, Onondaga Hill, N. Y., Mar. 25, 1840, Olive Henriette Huntington, daughter of Levi and Lucy (Mosher) Huntington. She was born Onondaga Hill, N. Y., Mar. 1818; died Syracuse, N. Y., Jan. 12, 1853. He married 2nd, Onondaga Hill, N. Y., Aug. 31, 1853, Sophia Huntington (cousin of Olive), daughter of Jeremiah and Lydia (Wait) Huntington. She was born Onondaga Hill, N. Y., Oct. 9, 1818; died Jan. 25, 1866. He mar. 3rd, Syracuse, N. Y., Oct. 4, 1870, Frances Ann Sharp, daughter of William and Abigail Clark (Green) Sharp. She was born Syracuse, N. Y., Mar. 16, 1827. Res. Salina, N. Y., and Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Children:

1710. Edward Henry, b. Salina, N. Y., Oct. 16, 1842; d. Iowa Falls, Ia., Aug. 5, 1876, unm. A soldier in Civil War, enlisted in Apr. 1861 in the 3rd Reg., N. Y., Vols; later he was Supt. of an oil well and engaged in lead mining in Illinois; was afterwards with a R. R. survey in Indian Territory; and a member of the firm H. Alvord & Sons.
1711. Thomas Gold, b. Salina, N. Y., Sept. 20, 1851.

Horace Alvord moved to Iowa in 1870, and was head of the firm H. Alvord & Sons, breeders and dealers in live stock, and was also engaged in farming. His widow was living in 1905.
