Alvin White Alvord (originally Alvin White Garside) assumed the name Alvord, his mother's maiden name by act of the Legislature of Mass., about the year 1845. Soon after this time he removed from Hampshire Co., Mass., to N. Y., where he has since lived in Harpersville, Masonville and Sidney, with the exception of two years and eight months in Kan. He served six months in the Civil War, in the 144th N. Y. Reg., Co. B. During his enlistment the regiment was not called out, being encamped at Upton Hill, 9 miles from Washington. Mr. Alvord suffered from an old cut in his foot and was discharged. He is a tailor by trade but for a number of years has been farming and gardening.

He was born Ossian, Allegany Co., N. Y., Aug. 15, 1818; died East Oakland, Cal., Mar. 4, 1895. Res. Canton, China. Children:
