Stephen Wilbur Alvord commenced to learn the printer's trade in the office of the "Trojan," Troy, Pa., at the age of fourteen. He finished his apprenticeship in the office of the "Bradford Argus," Towanda, Pa. In 1860 he was admitted to the partnership, but retired in 1862, and published the "Reporter" for 15 years. In 1879 he established the "Daily Review" with his son, Noble N. In 1885 he removed to Minneapolis, Minn., and published the "Commercial Bulletin," but returned East in 1888, and the following year published the "Daily News." Mr. Alvord was postmaster at Towanda, Pa., from 1861-1879, an active worker in the cause of temperance, and a total abstainer himself.
