

near Lockport, N. Y., Feb. 25, 1893; married Buffalo, N. Y., Oct. 10, 1839, George Marsden Barnes, son of Eli Y. and Lois (Lyon) Barnes, who migrated from Hartford, Conn. He was born near Watkins Glen, N. Y., Dec. 3, 1816; died Lockport, N. Y., Nov. 13, 1905. Res. Medina, N. Y. Children:

- a. Romaine Alvord, b. Cambria, N. Y., Oct. 6, 1840; mar. Oct. 14, 1868, Jennie Crapsey, daughter of Moses C. Crapsey. He resides on the homestead property, land which was bought by Daniel Alvord of the Holland Purchase Company in 1815, and is situated about three miles from Lockport, N. Y., now known as Willow Lawn Fruit Farm. He enlisted in 1862 as sergcant in Co. A. Sharpshooters 151st N. Y. Volunteers. In March 1864 he was promoted to the position of 2nd. Lieut., and transferred to the 31st. U. S. C. Infantry. In March 1865 he was promoted to the position of 1st. Lieut. and Adjutant of the Regiment under the command of Gen. Sheridan. The division to which he belonged was among the first to enter Petersburg, and then press on in pursuit of Gen. Lee, until his surrender, Apr. 9, 1865. He was mustered out at Hartford, Conn., 1865.
- b. Eugene Lyon, b. Cambria, N. Y., Sept. 18, 1843; d. Oct. 1867. He volunteered and entered the Union Army as a private before he was nineteen years of age, but was soon promoted to the position of 2nd. Lieut., and then to 1st. Lieut., and at the age of twenty-one he was a captain. At the close of the war he was placed in command of Fort Sumter, and was Provost Judge of the city of Charleston, S. C. In the autumn of 1866 he received an appointment in the Regular Army of Lieut., and was breveted Major in the volunteer service. He was ordered to join his regiment in New Orleans in November of the same year; but the following October he fell a victim to yellow fever.
- c. Ernest Arthur, b. Cambria, N. Y., Feb. 1, 1846; res. Detroit, Mich., 1905; mar. Apr. 27, 1870, Minnie Spear of Brooklyn, N. Y.

George Marsden Barnes lived in Niagara and Orleans Co. from the time he was eighteen years old. He was a farmer.
