Muskegon, Mich., 1874. Occupation, carpenter. No children.

1747. ABIGAIL ALVORD (*David, Alexander, Obed, Asahel, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Geneseo, N. Y., 1829; died Tecumseh, Mich., Apr. 1906; married Tecumseh, Mich., 1852, Lyman T. Baylis, son of Thomas and Anna Baylis. He was born 1828; died Reed City, Mich., 1903. Res. Reed City and Tecumseh, Mich. No children.

Lyman T. Baylis was a miller. Mrs. Baylis was in the millinery business at Reed City, Mich. After the death of her husband she returned to Tecumseh and led a very lonely life, with little means for her support. Mr. S. W. Anderson of Tecumseh, an old friend of the family, showed her every kindness. The unfortunate woman was struck by a train on the Lake Shore Ry. in Oct., 1905, and died the following April.
