

received the honorary degree of A. M. from that institution in 1864. He taught school in Dover, N. J., for a brief period before entering the Seminary at Princeton in 1848, where he remained two years. He was licensed to preach by the Presbytery of Elizabethtown, N. J., Apr. 18, 1850.

From 1851 until 1877 Dr. Stevenson was in the state of Indiana, preaching successively at Knightstown, Indianapolis, Union, and Indianapolis again, where for two years he was State Librarian, and compiled and published, "Indian's Roll of Honor and Patriotic Dead," which appeared in 1864. In 1877 he returned to N. J., and preached in the Presbyterian churches at Branchville, N. J., Amboy, N. J., Brooklyn, N. Y., and Gloucester City, N. J. In 1895 he retired from the active ministry but preached for a short time at Metuchen, N. J. Dr. Stevenson was commissioner to the General Assembly at Charleston in 1852, at New Orleans in 1858, at Indianapolis in 1859, at Saratoga in 1890. His second wife was Miss Adele E. Manning whom he married Dec. 6, 1887. She is still living at Perth Amboy, N. J., 1907.
