

Book and Newspaper Folding Machines.

Book-Folding Machines.

These machines have been much improved within the last year. Their work is universally acknowledged to be superior to hand-folding, better in register, and is performed at the rate of 30 to 60 signatures per minute for fine book work.

They are adapted for books of square sheets of sixteen and thirty-two, and 12mos of twenty-four pages, cutting off the inset, and inserting as done by hand, or folding separately, at will; also, single 12mos, folding two or three signatures to the sheet, cutting and folding each signature separately; also, sheets of thirty-six and forty-eight pages, cutting and inserting, and cutting and folding sheets, separately, in great variety.

They can be altered, in a few minutes, to fold different sizes and styles. They pack the folded sheets "jogged up," and pressed, ready for the "gathering table," or to be stored, in a very complete manner, in one receptacle, and deposit the imperfect ones, folded, in another.

Their ready adjustment, simplicity, compactness, durability and economy of operation, recommend them to every bookbinder.

These machines will fold 8vo at about one-fourth, and double 12mo at one-twelfth the cost of doing the same work by hand, and will save their cost in one year.

News-Folding Machines.

These machines are designed expressly for the rapid and more perfect folding of Newspapers. They fold them in a very superior manner, at the rate of from 60 to 100 sheets per minute, into form for single or club mailing, or for carrier delivery, at the option of the feeder.

The folded sheets are tightly compressed by a PACKING apparatus, thus greatly improving the appearance of the sheet, and facilitating the labor of mailing.

Many valuable improvements have recently been made in these machines, rendering them more rapid, accurate and reliable in their operation.

Since April 1st, 1871, this machine has been so improved and modified as to make the first fold on an entirely new principle, making it positive and accurate, while the sheet is securely held in position.

They can be relied on for doing their work promptly and with neatness, at a cost of about one-fourth to one-fifth of that of hand-labor.

Periodical Binding.

PASTING, FOLDING AND TRIMMING MACHINES.—These machines are designed for binding pamphlets and periodicals of eight, sixteen, twenty-four and thirty-two pages with economy and dispatch, taking the sheets as they come from the press, folding them in "register," pasting the pages together at the back fold, and trimming or not trimming the head and folded edge, at pleasure, leaving the front margins full.

The reading public desire that their periodicals shall come to them ready to be read, saving them the necessity of sewing and cutting, or pinning and tearing open with the fingers before reading, or the annoyance of turning an ancient sheet.

One object of these machines is to fill this want. Thirty-eight different sizes and styles are now manufactured. Sold subject to trial and approval.
