

years, also quartermaster for a time, commanding various companies and battalions and in various engagements. He was graduated in 1887 from the U. S. Cavalry and Infantry School at Ft. Leavenworth, Kan., and during the five years following was instructor in the Department of Modern Languages at West Point. In the Spanish War he was appointed major and chief ordnance officer of volunteers, but served as Adj. Gen. of various brigades and divisions at Mobile, Ala., Miami, Fla., and Jacksonville. Discharged from the volunteer service, he joined his regiment at the close of the war and went to the Philippines. While there he was in various engagements with his regiment and served as Major and Adj. Gen. of Volunteers in the 2nd Division, 8th Army Corps—Gen. MacArthur's division—to which office he was appointed in 1899. Here he remained in Northern Luzon until 1901. Though named by the President for Brevet of Major for "conspicuous gallantry in action against Philippine Insurgents at Cainta, P. I., Mar. 16, 1899," while serving as captain 20th Infantry, he failed of confirmation by the Senate with all other brevets conferred at this time on the ground that U. S. was not at war. Mr. Alvord served on the general staff until June, 1905, when he was appointed major and military sec., and promoted within a week to Lieut. Colonel, Military Sec., in which capacity he still serves at Washington, D. C. The services in U. S. A., of Gen. Benj. Alvord and his son Col. Benj. Alvord, extend over a period of eighty years.
