

*More.* Tenn acres, on the easterly side of west meadow a white oake marked at the northwesterly, on the southerly side the marks, a small black oake at the westerly end, and a beach on the other corner on the same side, and at the other corner from the beach the mark is a small white oake, the lott being thirty and ten pole in breadth, and fifty in Length.

*East of west meadow.*

March 31. 1697.

*More.* The head of the John Kingman's land where there hous stands being measured And squared off and one Acre added to the head. The boundry for the range of the head towards the westerly side is a Red oake marked on two sides and Running in a straight line to the head of that which was Jonathan Cary's ten acres to a Red oake sapling marked on four sides, then above said straight line, is the bounds between John Kingman & Joseph Edson. & the Red oake sapling the corner bounds, between Joseph Edsons & the Kingman's land.

*Head of Home Lott.*

March 31. 1697.

*More.* Nine Acres. laid out for John Kingman lying on the North Easterly side of Joseph Edsons land & on the head of that ten acres. which they bought of Jonathan Cary beginning at a Red oake sapling marked on four sides that is the corner tree of Joseph Edsons and running by Joseph Edsons line, Northwesterly to a white oake that is the corner tree of Joseph Edsons land, & from this Runing Northwesterly about Twelve Rods to a swamp pine marked on four sides & so running easterly by the spruce swamp. which is the bounds, till it come to a small white oak marked on four sides and then running by their own lands till it meet with the Red oak first mentioned.

*Huckleberry Plain.*

March 31. 1697.

*More.* Ten acres — for John Kingman Joyning to his ten acres on the hucklebery plaine beginning at a white oake corner tree of his nine acres and running from this white oak Northeasterly to a Red oak marked on four sides being about thirty six rods & from s<sup>d</sup> Red oak running south easterly about 52 pole to a stake & then Running southwesterly to a white oak tree the corner bounds of his ten acres above named, from this running in a straight line to the white oake first mentioned.

May 30. 1711.

Ten acres of land laid out for John Kingman, of Henry Kingmans Right lying on the East side of their uppermost fifty acre lott by Salisbury plaine River. Beginning at a Red oak tree which is the corner bounds of Joseph Edson's land from thence running Fifty two pole East to a Red oak tree, marked on four sides, from thence running North. 34 pole to a stake, from thence running west to a great white oak marked on 4 sides, and from thence bounded by the abovesd. Fifty acres to the bounds first mentioned with sufficient Allowance for highways.
