Of THOMAS BOREMAN,² the eldest son of Thomas senior, but little is known. He was made a freeman in 1682,¹ and was granted leave by the town of Ipswich, Mass., in 1692, to erect a grist mill on Labor-in-vain Creek, and as this creek is the one over which his father had built the bridge in 1656-7, and which was "about his farme," he without doubt remained in possession of the old homestead. It is known that his wife's name was Sarah, and the records of the town show that she died 4 April, 1735. He died 13 March, 1743.
