1.—**Corinthia**, b. Oct. 9, 1793; d. M'ch 10, 1838, Otis, Mass. m. Lester Filley, Jan. 26, 1814. T.; moved to Otis, where he practiced law, and from there to Lee, Mass. Was a distinguished lawyer, member of State Senate, and filled other important offices. He established three Episcopal churches; m. secondly, Maria Wilcox, of Lanesboro, Mass. *Issue:*

2.—**Thomas**, b. Aug. 30, 1795; d. Nov. 14, 1865; Gt. Barrington, Mass. Grad. Williams Coll., Mass., 1814. Spent two years at Litchfield law school, and studied law with Sam. L. Jones, of Stockbridge, Mass., whose sister Rachel, a beautiful and accomplished woman, he m. fall of 1818; she d. 1850, dau. of \*Gen. Jones of Hebron, Ct. Practiced law in Sandisfield to 1838. Was High Sheriff of Berkshire Co., Mass., many years; representative in Legislature 2 or 3 times. At coll. boarded in the family of Lyman Beecher. *Issue:*

3. Samuel, b. April 19, 1822; d. Nov., 1843; coll. associate of Geo. P. Biggs, son of Gov. B.
4. Clara M., b. Mch. 6, 1824; d. July 11, 1888; m. Leonard G. McDonald, a retired merchant, res. Glens Falls, N. Y. "She was a true, loyal, loving and noble wife and woman, whom scarcely one ever knew but to love and admire her noble character." Episcopal church, in which a very handsome memorial window is placed to her memory. No children.
5. Thomas, Jr., b. Sept. 1, 1826; d. Sept. 6, 1826.
6. Thomas A., b. Nov. 26, 1827; d. June 6, 1868; single.

\* Gen. Jones was a comm. officer under George III. in the war of 1775, also under Washington in Col. Army, 1756, stationed at Lake George.
