The dam was afterward swept away and the land covered with gravel and dirt, so it was never after cultivated; supporter of Pres. Ch.

(His father, Timothy Rose, was one of the purchasing agents for and founder of a colony removing from Mass. to G., Ohio, in the fall of 1805; he was a judge and deacon of Pres. Church; d. 1813.) Entered Pres. ministry about 1828; grad. O. University; a prominent lecturer on theological and moral subjects; d. Jan. 10, 1857, New Lexington, O. His ancestry were Scotch and first settled at E. Granville, Mass., 1741. (While Abigail, his great grandmother, lived, she had over 450 living descendants; d. aged 103). *Issue:*
