

87 Addison Twining, son of **41** Abner, b. June 24, 1810, Frankfort, Maine, d. April 3, 1882, F.; m. Jan. 6, 1849, Emeline, dau. of Henry Colson, b. April 12, 1831. Lived on the old homestead at F., where all his children were born; wid. res. in Winterport, Me.

88 Harrison Twining, son of **41** Abner; b. Nov. 14, 1814, Frankfort, Me., where he resided until 1885, when he moved to Au Gres, Michigan; fell from a hammock, causing paralysis, from which he d. Nov. 5, 1887. He was a prominent Universalist minister, a brilliant conversationalist, a man well read and of sterling worth. Married, *first*, Olive Higgins, Oct. 20, 1842, b. Nov. 13, 1824, d. Sept. 20, 1845; two chil; d. inf.; m. *secondly*, Bethiah Higgins (sister of first wife), June 10, 1846, d. Oct. 16, 1846; m. *thirdly*, Mary Jane Cole (cousin to first two), April 27, 1847, b.
