

Walker, of Stephenville, King and Queen County. It was printed 1589. The New Testament added 1602.* The record of the marriage of **Thomas Walker**³ and his wife, Susanna, is given, and then appear the following entries:

“My dafter, Mary Peachy Walker, was born y^e first oure of y^e thirtieth day of Janeyary, 1710, babbised the day follow^s, y^e 31st.

John Walker, borne y^e 29th of April at five, 1711.

Thomas Walker borne Jan^y y^e 15th 1715.”

This Mary Peachy Walker, daughter of **Thomas Walker**³ and his wife, **Susanna**, married, May 13, 1732, Dr. George Gilmer, of Williamsburg. Their son, George Gilmer, married Elizabeth Lewis, daughter of Thomas Lewis and Jane Strother. Their daughter, Lucy Gilmer, married William Wirt.

John Walker, son of **Thomas Walker**³ and his wife, **Susanna**, married, November 9, 1735, Miss Baylor, of Essex County. To them were born three children: a son, Baylor, and two daughters, Susanna and Elizabeth. One of these daughters is thought to have been the wife of Rev. James Maury, who married, in 1773, a Miss ~~Walker~~ ^{Walker}. Peter Fontaine, uncle of Rev. James Maury, stated in a letter that the wife of the latter was “a Miss Walker, niece of **Dr. Thomas Walker**.”⁴ The latter had only one brother, John, who married Miss Baylor, so it would seem that this John must have been the father of the wife of Rev. James Maury.
