

THE FICKETT-SEARS

Livingston Manor married Jeannette Sears.

The tomb of Francis Fickett and Augusta Sears is in the Old Marble Cemetery, New York City.

The Livingston-Fulton tomb is in old Trinity churchyard. The tomb of the Bogardus-Livingston-Robinson family (among whom is Dr. Livingston of Saratoga) of Castle Cottage, Goshen, New York, is in the present Fickett plot in the beautiful "City of the Dead," at Greenwood. The Hager-Bogardus plot is in Washington, South River, N. J. The Hager-Fickett-Ker plot is at New York Bay, N. J., and Greenwood.

The Innes-Ker and Livingston family were united in marriage in Scotland; therefore (Sarah B. F. S. I. K. Hager) is related to the Livingston family on my father's branch, the Innes-Ker, and my mother's branch, the Fickett-Sears-Livingston, and again on the Bogardus-Livingston.
