William Murray, on the Pay Roll as Corporal in Captain Joshua Babcock's Company in the Battalion commanded by Ebenezer Walbridge, Esq., Lt. Col. Commanding, in the service of the State of Vermont, 1781. Commencing of service May 1, 1781, Ending, November 14, 1781. For 193 days and 70 miles travel he was paid 14 pounds, 16 shillings, 9 pence.

The Pay Roll was approved and dated Sunderland, Aug. 21, 1783, and paid by the Treasurer to Thomas Tolman, Paymaster, Oct. 2, 1784.
