HENRY WINTER FULLENWIDER, lived in Ky. where he had a great many slaves and a beautiful plantation home with a house which cost twenty thousand dollars, and which has remained in possession of his descendants until very recent date. It was sold some time before 1912 much to the regret of all of the family, by his son John Wesley Fullenwider, as the place was quite too large and expensive to keep up. The land had always been owned by Fullenwidiers since the time of the Indians issue of Henry Winter Fullenwider & Amanda (in addition to the ones mentioned in book above :-
