The Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home Journal, Knights -town Ind., in its notice of Prof. Dunn's death says: "Prof. Dunn was elected Superintendent of the Home by the Board of Trustees June 13 1914, at a special meeting held in the Governor's office at Indianapolis, and he assumed his new duties July 1st. He continued in that capacity four and a half years, his resignation going into effect Dec. 30 1917."

"Few men, if any, have filled the position of Superintendent of the Home who had finer or nobler qualities than Prof. Dunn. Being highly educated, he managed the business of his office most successfully, and at all times put forth his best efforts to deal fairly, and indiscriminately with all with whom he came in contact.

"His conversation was a delight. He was not assertive or aggressive, but always courteous and kindly. He was a gentleman in every sense of the term, a good citizen, a patriot - as his Civil war record proves - and a devoted friend. He was highly esteemed by those who knew him best, and he left an influence with all the Home that was broad and uplifting."
