Archibald Dixon, only son of Rebecca Hart and Capt. Wynne, was one of the most distinguished men in the Green River Country; a successful lawyer; Representative in the Kentucky Legislature in 1830 and 1841; elected Lieutenant Governor in 1844-1848 on the Whig ticket; delegate to the Convention which framed the present Constitution of Kentucky; elected United States Senator to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Henry Clay in 1852, and author of the famous Kansas-Nebraska bill.
