

John Todd, third son of Col. C. S. Todd and Letitia Shelby, died unmarried.

Charles H. Todd, fourth son of Letitia Shelby and Col. C. S. Todd, now a prominent physician in Owensboro, Kentucky, was the youngest surgeon in Gen. Lee's army, and also President of the Medical Society, of Kentucky. He married Rosa Burwell, of Virginia.

Alfred Shelby, youngest son of Susanna Hart and Col. Isaac Shelby, whose talents and culture gave great promise of influence and usefulness, was cut down in early life, after having married his cousin, Virginia Hart. [See Virginia Hart.]

Mary Ann Hart, third daughter of Nathaniel Hart and Sarah Simpson, married Col. Richard Dallam, of Logan county, Kentucky. They left no family.

Chinoo (Indian name for Kentucky), youngest daughter of Nathaniel Hart and Sarah Simpson, was not, as has been stated, the first white child born in Kentucky. The exact location of her birth cannot now be ascertained, but it occurred in Virginia, October 25, 1779, in which State her father left his family on their route from North Carolina to Kentucky, while he went forward to the then wilderness country to prepare their future home. The perilous journey was completed in 1780, and they were compelled to seek refuge from the hostile Indians in the fort at Bonesboro, at which place and vicinity they remained until Mr. Hart's assassination by the Indians. Her mother's death occurring soon after, she, and her younger brothers and sisters, found a home in the family of their brother-in-law, Col. Isaac Shelby, and were reared by them as their own children.

In 1797 she married John Smith, of Frankfort, member of Kentucky Legislature, and died in Shelby county, Tennessee, at the advanced age of ninety years and three months.
