1. Eliza Paddock, born at Easton, Mass., Nov. 8, 1812; married at Columbus, O., Dr. Peleg Sisson, Dec. 13, 1838.  
He was a pioneer in Columbus and a very prominent physician there in the early days. He went and returned with Capt. A. B. Waters in the "John Farnum" on the voyage to Ireland in 1847.
2. Mary Smith, born at Easton, Mass., Mch. 14, 1814;  
*She died Mch 11, 1895* married John Lariman Gill, Oct. 29, 1833, at Brad-dock's Field Seminary, near Pittsburgh, Pa., where the six elder children of Asa and Kezia Waters went to school.  
He is now proprietor of the Gill Car Manfg. Co. John L. and William A. Gill were pioneers in Col-umbus. They were manufacturers and dealers in various kinds of hardware.
3. Kezia Richmond, born at Watervleit, N. Y., Dec. 17, 1816; married at Columbus, O., \*Noah Lindsley Wilson, May 20, 1840.  
*A. W. - 10*  
He was a native of Wood Co., Virginia, and died at Versailles, France, Aug. 10, 1867. He was the first President of the Marietta and Cincinnati R. R. and was largely connected with the Banking and other business interests of Southern Ohio. She married second, Isaac Burkill, Banker and Corn Broker of Leeds, England, Feb. 21, 1872. They reside in Scarborough, Eng. She has no children.
4. ASA BRADFORD, born at Watervleit, N. Y., Oct. 26, 1818;  
married Annette Searl Howes, Dec. 28, 1847.
5. Hannah Mirick, born at Pittsburgh, Pa., Mch. 30, 1821.  
married at Columbus, O., William Alfred Gill, (bro-ther to John Lariman Gill above) Oct. 23, 1839.
6. ISRAEL RICHMOND, born at Pittsburgh, Pa., Oct. 23, 1823;  
married Ellen Grosvenor Ward, Oct. 19, 1854.
7. Silas Mirick, born at Pittsburgh, Pa., Nov. 22, 1824;  
died Sept. 10, 1825.
8. Lydia Smith, born at Pittsburgh, Pa., April 30, 1827;  
died June 16, 1828.

\*He was a descendant, in the 7th generation, of Dorothy Whiting (dau. of Rev. Samuel Whiting of Lynn, Mass., born in Boston, Eng., 1597.) who m. Rev. Jeremiah Hobart, b. 1631, son of Rev. Peter Hobart, whose dau. Jael m. Joseph Bradford, son of Gov. Bradford. The mother of Dorothy Whiting was Elizabeth St. John, a descendant, in the 20th generation, of William de St. John, one of the Barons, who came over with William the Conqueror. Elizabeth St. John was also descended from a daughter of William the Conqueror and from Joan Plantagenet, commonly called Joan of Acre. She was also descended from the royal blood of Scotland and from the Saxon monarchs.
