

VI. ISRAEL RICHMOND, son of Edward and Reliance Paddock Richmond, was born July 11, 1755, and married Hannah Mirick, daughter of Ebenezer Mirick of Berkley, Oct. 17, 1776. He died April 25, 1825. She died about 1827. He resided in Richmondtown and was a joiner. He was of Middleboro when married; of Taunton in 1788; and Middleboro in 1794. Children:

1. Adino, did not marry; died 1805, aged 26.
2. Elias, married Lydia Richmond, a distant relative. They had one daughter, Lydia, who died aged 16. He died in 1817, aged 36, in Charleston, S. C.
3. Silas, born in 1782, married Mary Richmond, a sister of Elias' wife. He died aged 29. They had three children:
 1. Albin, born 1803; m. Elizabeth Upham, 1831, had three children, Josiah Horace, died Feb. 12, 1839, Mary Elizabeth and Hannah Eveline.
 2. Elias, born 1805; m. Zeroah Richmond, had daughter, Lydia. They lived at Taunton.
 3. Silas, born 1809; m. ————.
4. Bathsheba, married Samuel Miller of Middleboro, 1806; had nine children: Adino, Francis, Almira, Bathsheba, Susan, Samuel, Joseph, Kezia and Rhoda.
5. KEZIA PADDOCK, born March 6, 1787; m. ASA WATERS, at Providence, R. I., Oct. 24, 1810. She d. Aug. 11, 1823. (See page 10.)
6. Israel, married Laura Leach, 1811; had three children, Laura, Lucy, and one which died very young.
7. Edward, married Eliza Tinkham, of Fairhaven, 1825; had three children, Edward Augustus, Ansel Carmel, Mary Elizabeth.
8. Hannah, married Samuel Tripp, of Fairhaven, 1823; had four children, Samuel Mirick, Adino Richmond, Laura B. and Edward R.
9. Ebenezer, married Jane Trimble, of Pittsburg, Pa., 1823, had three children, Israel, William and Ebenezer.
10. Enoch, married Susan Ames, 1824. Had eight children, Mary, Israel, David, Susannah, Enoch, Lucy and twins who died before they were named.



"Rev. Edward Richmond, D. D., b. Middleboro, Mass., June 29, 1767. Brown Coll., R. I., 1789; ordained Stoughton, 1792; resigned 1817 and in June of that year installed over third parish in Dorchester, Mass.; resigned on account of paralysis, May 18, 1833, and died April 10, 1842, in his 75th year. He was thrice m. (1) to Lucy, dau. of Rev. Joseph Palmer, H. U. 1747; ord. Norton South Precinct, Mass., 1753, and d. 1791 in his 62nd year; (2) to Sarah Manning of Ipswich, Mass., in May, 1813; (3) to Christiana, dau. of James Swan, Esq., of Dorchester, who survived him; his dau., Sarah, m. Francis H. Blanchard."

A romantic love story is told of his daughter, Lucy Palmer Richmond, and William Austin, a Sea Captain, whom her father would not allow her to marry. She died Oct. 25, 1816, aged 20. Dr. Richmond afterwards met Captain Austin and acknowledged him as his son, and with her father's permission he erected a headstone to Lucy's memory, at Stoughton.
