John Clerkson of parish of St. Paul, Nevis, Clerk, for divers reasons and in consideration of his love, etc., for his grandson William Pemberton, son of his (the donor's) daughter Elizabeth, wife of Edward Pemberton of the parish of St. George, Nevis, gives the said William Pemberton one slave.

Will of William Pemberton of the Island of Nevis, dated 25 March 1783.

Gives to his three sons—

Edward Pemberton	} and the survivor of them, their heirs and assigns,
Robert Pemberton	
William Butler Pemberton	

all his estates, plantations, negroes, etc. (except as otherwise specified), upon trust that they shall permit his dear wife Margaret Pemberton for her natural life to occupy his house at Terrace Gut, where he then lived, with offices, etc.

After payment of debts the Trustees are to raise and pay

To son Francis and daughters Elizabeth, Margaret, and Sarah Pemberton, £500 apiece as soon as possible, with interest at 8 per cent. till paid.

To dear wife Margaret, six negroes and all household and kitchen furniture, etc., as well as the sole use of a good and safe riding horse.

To son Roger, £100 "current money only, because I have in my lifetime paid a great deal of money for him and am still to pay more."

To "daughter Frances Maynard, wife of Walter Maynard, Esq.," £25, to be paid twelve months after Testator's decease, "as I made provision for her on her marriage."

Estates to be kept in good repair by Trustees, and his son Edward to be Manager on a reasonable salary during continuance of trusts.

To son Edward, his heirs and assigns for ever, the plantation lately purchased of Mr. Dunbar, on which the said Edward now resides, "together with a part of the land that I purchased from my nephew Robert Pemberton and Miss Frances Williams,* now Frances Jones, and wife of the Rev. William Jones, which said

* Robert Pemberton, afterwards Rector of St. George's, Basseterre, married Elizabeth, a sister of this Frances Williams, who married the Rev. Wm. Jones at St. John's, Nevis, on 18 July 1776.
