

Q. What officers of the insurance company did you see around the bank and what were they doing there? A. Saw the secretary; don't know what he was doing; paid no attention to his business.

Q. What was his name? A. L. K. Davis.

Q. Did you ever see any books of the insurance company in the building occupied by the bank? A. I have seen some of the books, but couldn't swear whether they were the insurance company's or not.

Q. What books did you see there to which you refer in your last answer? A. I saw some law books and some blank books, such as are used in offices.

Q. For what purpose were these blank books that you speak of used? A. I don't know.

Q. Were you at any time cashier of the Farmers Bank? A. My name was used as cashier of the Farmers Bank. No, sir, I was not cashier of the Farmers Bank; I was working for Mr. Reynolds at \$20 per week.

Q. Who was cashier of the Farmers Bank, if you know? A. I don't know, only that my name was used as cashier; afterwards learned that N. M. Reynolds was cashier.

Q. Who is N. M. Reynolds and where does he or she live? A. That I don't know; I was simply working under instructions.

Q. Did you ever meet or become personally acquainted with N. M. Reynolds? A. Not that I know of.

Q. What is the name of the young lady who worked in the same office with you in the Byram Hotel building? A. Nannie Reynolds.

Q. Isn't that the party known as N. M. Reynolds, whom you say was cashier of the Farmers Bank? A. I don't know.

Q. What money, if any, did the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company have on deposit in the Farmers Bank during the month of December, 1886? A. I could not say, as Mr. Reynolds attended to that business.

Q. Who was acting as cashier of the Farmers Bank in December, 1886? A. I don't know that the bank had any cashier any more than I before stated.

Q. Did you do any work at any time as cashier of said bank? A. I did some work where my name was used.

Q. What did you do as cashier when your name was used? A. Did some correspondence.

Q. Did you, as cashier of the bank or otherwise, keep any books for the bank containing accounts of the bank? A. I did not.

Q. Have you at any time seen any notes taken by the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company, or in which the name of the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company was printed as payee, in the Farmers Bank? A. I have seen some notes, but don't remember of ever seeing any of them in the bank.

Q. Where and in whose possession did you see the notes? A. I saw them in the company's office, in the hands of the clerks.

Q. Have you seen any of these notes in Atchison since January 1st, 1887; if so, where and in whose possession? A. I have not seen any of them.

Q. Have you seen any notes taken by the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company, or in which the name of the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company or name of John N. Reynolds was printed as payee, since January 1, 1887; if so, where and in whose possession? A. I have not.

Q. Did you, as cashier of the Farmers Bank, on the 16th day of November, 1886, make a statement showing that the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company had on deposit in the Farmers Bank the sum of \$50,698.16, for the payment of their losses? A. I don't remember the date. Under the instructions of Mr. Reynolds I did sign a statement; I don't remember what the amount was or anything about it now.

Q. Did you sign that statement as cashier of the Farmers' Bank? A. As before stated, I signed the statement under instructions. I don't remember whether I signed it as cashier or not.
