

- Q. How long did you have them in your possession? A. Two or three hours may be.
- Q. Did you take them out of that building? A. Yes, I did.
- Q. Where did you take them? A. I took them to Hetherington's bank.
- Q. For what purpose? A. I took them there to sell them.
- Q. What did you do with them after that? A. I could not sell them. I took them back again.
- Q. Have you seen any of those notes since? A. No.
- Q. Was Mr. Reynolds there at the time in the Building? A. I don't believe he was.
- Q. Had you seen him in the building that day or about that time? A. I think I had.
- Q. Did Mr. Reynolds or Mr. Hall inform you how much there was in the batch of notes that they delivered to you, or Hall delivered to you? A. I think they had. This man had some figures made on a slip of paper.
- Q. Do you remember about what those figures were? A. Yes, I believe I do.
- Q. State, will you. A. Something like \$3,100.

The following is the testimony of A. S. Hall, on said hearing, so far as material as taken from the same bill of exceptions:

DIRECT EXAMINATION:

Q In whose employment have you been for some time. A Mr. Reynolds.

Q How long have you been in Mr. Reynolds' employ. A I don't remember just exactly the time, some time in September or October.

Q Prior to January 1st, 1887, what business was Mr. Reynolds engaged in here. A I believe he was in the Atchison Live Stock Insurance business.

Q Were you in the employ of the company? A I worked in the company's office; I don't know who it was. I was employed by Reynolds.

Q Since January 1, 1887, what business has Mr. Reynolds been engaged in. A. He has been in different kinds of business. He has been in the Farmers Bank there and the printing business.

Q Now, you have been clerking in the bank. A Yes.

Q Been cashier of the bank. A No, I don't know as I have been cashier of the bank; I might have been working in the bank.

Q You have been advertised as cashier. A I suppose I was acting cashier as much as anything else.

Q Who attends to the correspondence of the bank. A I attended to some of it.

Q Who attends to what you do not. A Mr. Reynolds.

Q Do you have any bank book in which you keep a memorandum of notes sent out for collection. A I think there is a book there; I don't know whether there is; of course there is a book in that bank for that business.

Q In which there is a memorandum of notes sent out for collection. A. Yes, sir.

Q Has there been any notes sent out for collection from that bank so called, since the first of February, 1887, that were payable on their face to the Atchison Live Stock Insurance Company. A I think there has.

Q Do you remember of delivering any notes to Mr. Webb. A. I remember of delivering some notes to Mr. Webb.

Q This gentlemen, Judge Webb here. A Yes, sir.
