A straw, or wicker, cradle, handed down from Gov. Joseph Dudley, who brought it from England. It has been used in all the generations since about 1700, and yet is well preserved. Owned by Mrs. H. H. Bradlee.

A silk wedding vest of one of the early Dudleys was exhibited by Mrs. J. Q. A. Chandler.

The quaint, pointed overshoes of Mrs. Gov. Joseph Dudley, owned by Mrs. Brigham of Lexington; also her christening blanket; also pistols and holsters of Col. William Dudley.

Silver tablespoons. Belonged to Lucretia Woodbridge, great-great-granddaughter of Mercy Dudley and Rev. Jno. Woodbridge, and great-grandmother of Catharine A. Dudley Bramble. Owned by Mrs. C. A. D. Bramble.

Autograph letter to Hon. John Dudley, member of the Committee of Safety of New Hampshire. He was son of James, (*Stephen,*<sup>3</sup> *Rev. Samuel,*<sup>2</sup> *Gov. Thomas*<sup>1</sup>). The letter was from Hon. Meshech Weare, also of the N. H. Committee of Safety, 1776. Owned by D. Dudley.

Gov. Joseph Dudley's commission with his coat of arms attached, making Lieut. Col. Winthrop Hilton commander of the Norridgewock Expedition, 1706. Owned by D. Dudley.

Frontispiece of a book once owned by Samuel Sewall, jr., (son of Judge Sewall) who married Rebecca, daughter of Gov. Joseph Dudley, in 1702. This leaf has Sewall's autograph on it and the arms of G. B., and was probably of a law book. Owned by Dean Dudley, 1892.
