Many portraits were hung on the walls and in a showcase were silver plate, china, and the personal effects of many of the illustrious ancestors. \* \* \* At 5.30 the family sat down to dinner. The souvenir menu card contained a portrait of Dudley Castle as it appeared in 1881, the seal of Gov. Thomas Dudley and the coat of arms of his son Gov. Joseph Dudley. Mr. Joseph H. Moors of Boston, a descendant of Anne Bradstreet, the daughter of Gov. Dudley, read a paper on the life of Gov. Thomas Dudley, reviewing his work as a citizen, soldier and public official. A letter from Dr. Oliver Wendell Holmes, who is also a descendant of Anne Bradstreet, was read, in which he regretted his enforced absence. He also wrote: 'After so many generations it may not be possible to trace the lineaments of the old head of the family, but it will be interesting to look for them, and it is possible that resemblances in family would show themselves and be brought out in photograph, and I would suggest that all the descendants be photographed in a group.' Mr. Dean Dudley, of Wakefield, read a paper on 'The Family Tomb,' which is in the Eustis Street burying ground. Rev. Edward Everett Hale said this country and the constitution were founded on religious principles. Nine tenths of the people in New England are working with a conscientious purpose, and it is the same theological or religious sentiment beneath the states that prevailed in the people that came here with Gov. Dudley. Letters of regret were read from Gov. Russell, Lieut. Gov. Haile, Mr. Jason H. Dudley of Colebrook, N. H., Prof. Charles Eliot Norton of Harvard, Col. Guilford Dudley of Topeka, Kan., Hon. Leverett Saltonstall and Col. Henry Lee."
