

East Haddam. His wife removed to Kinsman, O., in 1811; she died at Hartford, O., July 27th, 1838, and was buried at Kinsman.

John's father was Richard Andrews, of East Haddam. He was born January 14th, 1711-12. The name of his first wife is unknown; he m. 2nd, Elizabeth Ackley, and died Oct. 29th, 1785. His father was Samuel Andrews; called "Samuel the settler." He m. Eleanor Lee, by whom he had sixteen children in the space of twenty-three years. She died—date unknown—when 2nd he m. June 1st, 1736, Mrs. Mary Holmes, widow of Capt. John Holmes of East Haddam. He died Dec. 14th, 1758. His father was Thomas Andrews of Middletown, whose name appears in the list of freemen of Hartford in Oct. 1669. He was appointed chimney viewer on the south side in Hartford in Dec. 1675; was succeeded by his brother Samuel in 1679. The inventory of his estate gives the name of his widow as "Abigail" and his children are named as "Mary, Thomas, John, Samuel, Hannah, Elizabeth and Sarah, children of the deceased." The inventory was taken and returned to Probate Court at Hartford March 3rd, 1690. From records it appears that he was twice married; that his first wife was "Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas Spencer, Sr., of Hartford."

"William Andrews, the schoolmaster of Hartford" was the father of John; this Thomas, Samuel, who was born Oct. 20th, 1645; Elizabeth who m. Edward Grannis May 3rd, 1654; and Esther who m. Thomas Spencer, Jr. William Andrews' first wife's name was Mary. She died at Braintree, Mass., Nov. 19th, 1639. He m. 2nd, Abigail ———, who was the mother of his children. He died about April, 1659, for his will dated April 1st, 1659 says, "I William Andrews, being sick and weak" &c.

The record credits him with being one of the Hooker company that settled Hartford 1635-6. He was the first town clerk there 1640 to 44. Schoolmaster 1640 to 42. Juryman 1644. Confirmed Recorder March 4th, 1651, which shows that he was a man of education and of influence in the colony. His widow, Abigail, divided his property; which according to the inventory amounted to £211, 14s.11d. among the children as directed by his will; and m. Nathaniel Bearding.

d. Daughters of Seth and Lucy (Thompson) Perkins. He was born in Hartland, Conn., Feb. 29th, 1780. Went to Barkhamsted about 1792 and to Canandaigua, N. Y., about 1800. In April, 1804, he shouldered his knapsack which contained all his earthly possessions and emigrated to Ohio. In October of the same year he m. Lucy Thompson, (who with her parents had moved from Farmington, Conn., to Hartford, O., that same year) and settled in Fowler, O., where he resided until 1818, when he sold out and moved to Kinsman; died there Feb. 15th, 1846. She died July 20th, 1862. Buried at Kinsman, O.
