1. **Thomas Temple**, of whom later.
2. **George Temple**; died young.
3. **John Temple**; founder of the Line of Frankton.¹
4. **Alexander Temple**; founder of the Line of Long House.²
5. **William Temple**; a merchant in London; not 21 in 1597; not alive in 1642; he married, prior to 1611, Jane, daughter of Sir Thomas Beaumont, of Stoughton, co. Leicester, Kt.; in 1633 he had daughters living, besides other children.
6. **Peter Temple**; not 21 in 1597; he married, probably later than 1611, — Kendall; he was alive in 1642.
7. **Catherine Temple**; married at Stepney, co. Middlesex, May 29th 1593, Sir Nicholas Parker, of Ratton, co. Sussex, Kt.; she was alive in 1611.
8. **Susan Temple**; married, later than 1582, Sir Thomas Denton, of Hillesdon, co. Bucks, Kt.; she was alive in 1611.
9. **Mary Temple**; married, later than 1582, John Farmer, of Marlow, co. Bucks; she was alive in 1611, and at that time probably a widow.
10. **Millicent Temple**; married at Stowe in 1583, Edward Saunders, of Rycksworth, co. Northampton; she was alive in 1611.
11. **Dorothy Temple**; christened at Stowe, September 28th 1572; married at Stowe in 1597, Paul Risley, of Chetwood, co. Bucks; she was alive in 1611.
12. **Elizabeth Temple**; married in 1600, William Fiennes, Viscount Saye and Sele; she was alive in 1611.

Account of John Temple.

An opulent man. He resided both at Burton Dassett and at Stowe. In 1590 he purchased the fee of the manor of Stowe.
