

Married: in Boston, January 20th 1767, Elizabeth, only daughter of James II Bowdoin; she was born in 1750; died in Boston October 25th 1809; buried October 30th in Boston, in the Bowdoin vault in the Granary Cemetery, Tremont street.¹ Will, Boston, July 10th 1809; proved November 13th 1809. 1. **Grenville Temple**, of whom later.

2. **Elizabeth Bowdoin Temple**; born, Boston, October 22d 1769; married, July 25th 1786, Hon. Thomas L. Winthrop; died, Boston, July 23d 1825; left issue.

3. **Hester Temple**; born, London, February 21st 1773; died there March 15th 1773; interred in the family vault, Christ Church, Boston.

4. **James Bowdoin Temple**; born, London, June 7th 1776; died at Twickenham, England, October 31st 1842; graduated at Columbia College, New York, in 1795; changed his name to Bowdoin, under the will of his uncle James III Bowdoin; married, London, at St. George's, Bloomsbury, April 26th 1808, Mary, daughter and co-heiress of Thomas Dickason, Esq., who pre-deceased him; he left issue a son and two daughters. The son, James Temple Bowdoin the younger, sometime a captain in the 4th Dragoon Guards, married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir William Clay, Bart. M. P.; he died without issue, in London, April 9th 1871. The elder daughter, Christine Temple Bowdoin, died unmarried at Florence, May 14th 1872. Her sister Laura Temple Bowdoin became the second wife of Gaston de Monroy, Prince of Pandolfina in Sicily, a Senator of the Kingdom of Italy; she died without issue at Florence, February 6th 1877.
